The Role

For the first time, in addition to our usual publication, *CJLPA* is working alongside international experts with the aim of identifying technological advancements which need legal codification in the 21st century. You would be part of a working group commencing fundamental research that will aim to present in our upcoming third edition the defined boundaries of a research plan, tackling how international societies are coping with, adapting to, and forming new legislative approaches that address the digital renaissance. In particular, we will focus on the law around intellectual property, artificial intelligence, technological regulation, and data. In the long term, this team will analyse and critique different approaches, culminating in presenting our own framework.

We will be recruiting three Associate Researchers to assist at this initial stage. We are seeking individuals who have previous experience assisting legally focused research projects and are inventive in formulating unique policy perspectives on the ways the law could regulate our evolving technological society. We desire a legal background, at either undergraduate or postgraduate level, but this is not a prerequisite if other relevant experience can be demonstrated.

- Should artificial intelligence be permitted to form new works without permission from the creators whose data they rely on? (200 words)
- What is the most important skill when working in a research team? (100 words)

We look forward to receiving your applications. These will be considered on a rolling basis, but we advise you to be in touch sooner rather than later. It is only with your help that we can make *CJLPA* 3 as much of a success as the previous editions have been.
