Submission Guidelines

We invite submissions on any topic that touches on law, politics, or art, defined as broadly as possible. We also appreciate interdisciplinary writing which combines any two or more of our fundamental disciplines.

We strive to represent a diverse range of subjects and styles. We therefore consider submissions that are academic, journalistic, or creative in nature.

Alongside our print editions, we regularly publish online-only pieces. For these articles, we encourage the inventive use of image and video material.

We have a maximum word limit of 6,000 words for all articles, including footnotes.

How to submit

Please send submissions in Word document form to generaleditors@cjlpa.org.

We accept submissions on a rolling basis. And we aim to respond to all submitted articles within eight to ten weeks.

Should your article be accepted, the editorial team will work with you extensively in the period before publication, providing guidance and suggestions until we reach a final version.

Images

Providing accompanying images or illustrations is encouraged. Please include as attachments individual image files and respective captions.

All images must either a) be covered by a Creative Commons (CC) licence or b) come with all relevant permissions. The best resource for CC images is <u>Wikimedia Commons</u>. If your image is not covered by CC, you will need the permission of:

• the artist(s);

• any museum, gallery, or individual from which you obtain the image; and (if applicable)

• people depicted in the image.

Referencing

We use a lightly modified version of <u>OSCOLA</u>. Whilst we do not expect perfect OSCOLA referencing, any attempt you make will be greatly appreciated.

Please submit articles in footnote form, including:



• Page number(s) of the section you are referencing or quoting

• Author(s), giving surname, full first name, and any middle initials

• Publication date (year only, unless published on a website or in a newspaper, in which case give the full date)

- URL and date accessed, if accessed online
- Title and editors of an edited volume
- Book publisher (location not needed)
- Journal or newspaper name
- Journal issue and volume number

Legal matters

Prior to publication, we ask all our contributors to sign a licence agreement granting us an exclusive right to publish their work. We can happily provide a copy of this document in advance on request. Alterations are possible in certain cases, subject to discussion.
